History Corner



This photo from 1923, shows the fog signal building with the adjacent tower. After a car ferry struck the end of the pier in 1930, the light tower was incorporated into the building, giving the appearance we have today. The elevated walkway allowed keepers to get to the lighthouse without walking along the often wavewashed pier. Until 1965, the pier was only as wide as the lighthouse, requiring the keepers to use another small walkway on the South face of the lighthouse to access the outer portion of the pier.



The postcard shows the old lighthouse (built in 1889) on the North pier, around the year 1900. The fog signal building was equipped with a 10" diameter steam whistle (mounted in the box on top of the building)

The lighthouse at this time served as the rear range lighthouse, with a smaller lens lamp ran out to a post at the end of the pier functioning as the front range light.
